



KARL A. STILES AND JAMES W. BUTCHER AWARD

ACADEMIC PROMISE

Established in 1990 by an anonymous donor, this award recognizes outstanding students in the department of Integrative Biology. This award is named in honor of two former professors whose research and leadership advanced the field of Zoology:

Dr. Karl Stiles joined the department Zoology in 1945, and was appointed as head of the department in 1948. He was an expert in human heredity & well known for his studies on the genetic basis of Down's Syndrome.

Dr. James Butcher joined Michigan State University as a faculty of Entomology, where he was appointed as a full professor in 1965. In 1974, he was appointed as the chair of the department of Zoology. Dr. Butcher was a renowned educator and researcher; an expert on soil zoology, pesticide side-effects, and forest insects.
